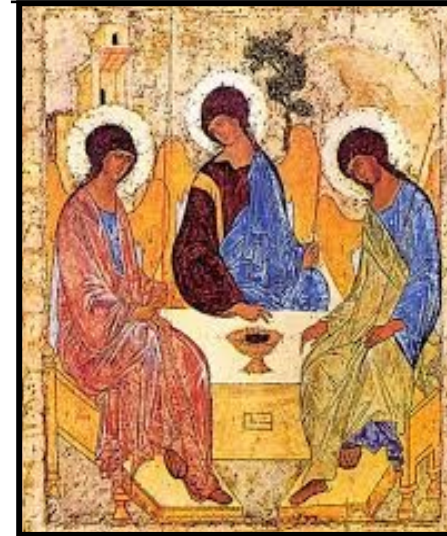

'The Most Holy Trinity This weekend is Saturday the 6th and Sunday the 7th June, the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, beginning the Tenth Week of Ordinary Time. The nuns of Mary, Queen of Apostles, sing Victoria's setting of Duo Seraphim. Two Seraphim cried one to another, and said, "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts, the whole world is full of your glory." We celebrate today the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. It is a celebration of the unconditional love that God has for humanity, which God manifests as the creating love (which is God the Father), the saving love (which is God the Son), and the sanctifying love (which is God the Holy Spirit). God therefore is love, and whoever lives in God lives in love and continues to manifest God's love to other people. The Trinity is a perfect example for us of how love enables us to open up our hearts to others in order to bring them closer to God and that they might have new life in God. It is this love that we hear about in today's reading from the Gospel of John.'

Work has

re-commenced on Ashington/ Pelletstown train station - 2109/13. The area is well condoned off and as soon as the work is finalised, we will make contact with Iarnrod Eir-eann about replanting with semi-mature native trees to replace the trees that were removed to allow access to the site.

We understand the car park there is open at the specified times - only for such 'cocooners'. It is great to see so many people using the open spaces in the area and the Phoenix Park. Also DCC are asking all dog owners to keep their pets on the lead at all times and to make sure they pick up after them.
