WE ARE PREPARING TO RESUME PUBLIC MASSES

The time is coming near when it will be possible for you to participate again in public masses. You will be no longer dependent on the webcam or the parish radio, which together with being able to link-in to facebook were a great facility to have during the lockdown. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all who enabled our means of communication to continue....the parish newsletter, the website and facebook.

However, there is no substitute for being physically present at the Eucharistic Celebration. The government has announced that public liturgies can resume on Monday, 29th June. Please God, all will go smoothly between now and then.

Our church is a very big building and can, in normal circumstances, accommodate 1200 people. However, with 2m social distancing we can accommodate only 96 people. The logistics of this are going to be quite complicated at the vigil mass on Saturday evening and the morning masses on Sunday morning. We are preparing a plan at the moment. When we are ready, with everything on paper, a leaflet will be delivered to every house in the parish. This will explain everything and will tell you what to expect if you come to mass on a Saturday evening or Sunday morning.

PRAYER BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

If you have access to the webcam: www.churchservices.tv/navanroad; you can see the Tabernacle in the Sanctuary of our Church at any time of the day or night, the Sanctuary lights are permanently lighting. Following on from last week, here are the next few prayers. They are available on the Parish Website also.

As we worship the Lord in the Eucharist, let us ask for the fullness of grace which this great Sacrament contains:

Lord Jesus, you said: 'Anyone who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him'. As we receive you in Holy Communion, change us into your likeness. Help us to live with your life, that we may see everything with your eyes, think about everything with your mind, and do everything as you want us to do it. Grant that through this Sacrament of love, which is the sign of unity and the bond of charity we may be drawn day by day into ever closer union with you and with one another, so that people may see in us the model of Christian living.

INTERCESSIONS

Lord Jesus, strengthen our faith in your Real Presence in this Sacrament, so that in the burdens of life we may find refreshment in your presence.

Response: May your Body and Blood be our life and our strength.

Lord, strengthen our faith in the Holy Sacrifice or the Mass, Memorial of the Last Supper and Renewal of the Sacrifice of Calvary. **Response:**

Lord, help us to make real in our lives the offering of ourselves which we make in the Mass. **Response:**

Lord Jesus, you are the Bread which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world. Grant that, nourished by your Body and Blood, we may have the power to make you present in our lives. **Response:**
