WORLD MISSION MONTH – OCTOBER

Extract from letter from Fr. Michael O'Sullivan-National Director of World Missions Ireland

This year, World Mission Sunday is in real jeopardy as the pandemic means that parishioners are not attending Mass, with less offerings in the basket. The implications for overseas communities in the months ahead will be devastating. In many of our poorer parishes overseas, missionaries are working on the front line. These women and men already do so much, walking hand-in-hand with marginalised communities, long before and long after any emergency. The pandemic adds even more challenges for missionaries, many of whom are in war-torn countries; remote areas where political conflicts, violent protests, extreme poverty, malnutrition, and diseases are rife. These are crises faced on a daily basis and, looking beyond COVID-19, sadly these crises will remain. It is for this reason that I am appealing to you directly. Your on-going support of World Mission Sunday plays an enormous part in easing their suffering – and I know it will continue to do so. In an attempt to help lessen the impact of COVID-19 on World Mission Sunday Mass collections in the coming weeks, parishes and communities will receive a supply of donation envelopes. May I ask you to distribute these in advance of October 18th? The envelopes will feature Sister Marie Catherine. From Niger, Sister Marie Catherine is one of tens of thousands of missionaries overseas who dedicate their lives to the marginalised. It is missionaries like her that your parish is supporting.

As there are no public Masses for the next few weeks throughout the Diocese this puts further financial strain on the funds.

ONGOING CORONAVIRUS MEASURES

As you are aware the Government has announced that Dublin is to remain on Level 3 of the Governments COVID-19 Resilience and National Recovery Plan for the next three weeks at least. All places of worship can remain open for private prayer only. Therefore all public Masses in our church are suspended for at least three more weeks. Mass will be celebrated daily in the parish church as per the following schedule:

Monday to Saturday 9am and 10am. The Rosary will be led each morning during October after 9a.m. Mass.

Sunday: Vigil mass at 6:30pm Saturday and 9am and 10:30am Sunday morning. No congregation can be present. These Masses will be streamed on the parish webcam and the parish radio.

If you wish to receive confession, please approach any of the Priests when you meet them, they will be happy to accommodate you.

Funeral Masses will take place at 10am with limited numbers of 25.

The church will be open for private prayer as per the following schedule:

Monday to Friday after the 10am morning Mass until 4pm

Saturday after the 10am morning Mass until 6pm

Sunday after the 10:30am morning Mass until 4pm.

When you are visiting the church for private prayer we ask that you follow HSE guidelines with regard to social distancing, sanitising your hands and wearing of face masks.

In the interest of hygiene and the safety of all our parishioners may we ask that you do not touch or kiss the many statues, the altar or other items in the Church. THANK YOU
