

ONGOING CORONAVIRUS MEASURES

As you are aware the number of coronavirus cases continues to rise and we are now on Level 5 restrictions. The implication of this is that all religious services are moved online, with places of worship remaining open for private prayer only. Therefore all public Masses in our church are suspended until further notice. Mass will be celebrated daily in the parish church as per the following schedule:

Monday to Saturday 9am and 10am.

Sunday: Vigil mass at 6:30pm Saturday and 9am and 10:30am Sunday morning.

No congregation can be present. These Masses will be streamed on the parish webcam and the parish radio.

Funeral Masses will take place at 10 am with limited numbers of 10.

(We ask to prevent the spread of the virus that you please do not congregate outside the Church during funerals-all funerals are online & recorded)

The church will be open for private prayer as per the following schedule:

Monday to Friday after the 10am morning Mass until 4pm

Saturday after the 10am morning Mass until 6pm

Sunday after the 10:30am morning Mass until 4pm.

When you are visiting the church for private prayer we ask that you follow HSE guidelines with regard to social distancing, sanitising your hands and wearing of face masks is compulsory.

The Parish Office will remain open for contact by phone or email 9am to 1pm Monday to Friday-Please contact if you wish to purchase a Mass Card (shared Masses) or need any other items or assistance of any kind.

Family Offering/1st & 2nd Collection envelopes can be dropped into the Parish Office or the Sacristy letterbox or 211 Navan Road.

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL New traffic plans for Phoenix Park:

This includes some gate closures; side roads closed; more cycle lanes; pedestrian crossings at sites such as Chesterfield Avenue, and inside main gate entrances. The matter is supposed to go on 'Public' consultation from 29th January for 6 weeks. This will be done on line only, in 'Virtual Rooms' .This procedure deprives all of our residents who are not on the Internet, by choice or otherwise, and disenfranchises them. The Community Council has raised this deprivation with various public reps. Currently: (1) 3rd stage of Bus Connects, including possible loss of every tree along Navan Road, has taken place only on line; (2) closure of Ashtown level Crossing, replaced with a long tunnel road UN-DER Mill Lane, Ashtown; UNDER Railway lines

only online. We have stated to our public reps, that all such infrastructure issues should be held over until Covid ends, and the public are free to participate correctly in 'Public' consultations. If you feel the same, perhaps make contact with your local public reps and let them know.
