LAETARE SUNDAY- HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY
'MOTHER MARY' -An excerpt from Pope Francis And The Family.
 "It is well known that Pope Francis has a particular devotion to the
 Madonna, whom he has repeatedly defined in these terms: 'She is our
 Mother. Let us entrust ourselves to her, because she cares for us like a *buona*
mamma(good mom). And again: 'For this reason Mary our Mother, Our lady
 shines out for us as a sign of sure hope. She is the Mother of Hope; on our
 journey, on our way, she is Mother of Hope. She is also the Mother who
 comforts us, the Mother of consolation and the Mother who accompanies us
 on the journey. Let us now pray to Our Lady all together. "Wherever the
 mother is, there the children are safe" and "if we are afraid, we know that
 we have our mother with us" just like children who take refuge in their
 mother's arms, so too, when "we are afraid, we go to her". And as the most
 ancient antiphon says, she "guards with her mantle, with her maternal
 protection". ' Mary's true motherhood also ensured for the Son of God an
 authentic human history, true flesh in which he would die on the cross and
 rise from the dead. Mary would accompany Jesus to the cross (cf. Jn 19:25),
 whence her motherhood would extend to each of his disciples (cf. Jn 19:26-
 27). She will also be present in the upper room after Jesus Resurrection and
 ascension, joining the apostles in imploring the gift of the Spirit (cf. Acts
 1:14). As the Mother of each of us, the Madonna is at our side in difficult
 moments such as herself was not spared.....' Mary also experienced the
 martyrdom of the Cross: the martyrdom of her heart, the martyrdom of her
 soul. She lived her Son's Passion to the depths of her soul. She was fully
 united to him in his death, and so she was given the gift of Resurrection.
 'Mary accompanies us, sustains Christians in their fight against the
 forces of evil. Prayer with Mary, especially the Rosary...has this 'suffering'
 dimension, that is of struggle, ...The Rosary also sustains us in the battle.'"

We had been lobbying DCC to have a Police Forum for our area, for several years before Pelletstown was developed; by the time it was granted, Pelletstown had commenced development, so it became **Navan Road/ Pelletstown Police Forum**.
