HOLY WEEK BEGINS THE SEVEN LAST WORDS OF JESUS

This is an excerpt from a book by James Martin SJ
"Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are
doing"-Jesus understands the challenge of forgiveness-....even if
you don't have the desire to forgive, if you have the desire for the
desire, that's enough. God can work with that. You may think, "Well I
can't do it." And you're right. You can't. But God can.

"Truly, I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise" - Jesus understands doubts about the afterlife— ...one day we pray we will be with Jesus in paradise. We have Jesus's word on it. We have Easter as proof and we know that God would never destroy the loving relationship that God has with us. And one day, like the Good Thief, we will see that that is true.

"Women, here is your son...here is your mother" Jesus understands a parent's love.....Mary now helpless again, he helps her. We don't have to be strong to help other people. We don't have to have money. We don't have to have professional training. We don't have to have academic degrees. We don't even have to be healthy. We only have to love and want to help.

"My God, My God, why have you forsaken me." Jesus understands feelings of abandonment.....So when you struggle in the spiritual life, when you wonder where God is, when you pray in doubt and darkness and even when you are close to despair, you are praying to someone who is fully human and fully divine, to someone who understands you fully.

"I am thirsty" Jesus understands physical pain.....God wants you to pray to him. God desires a relationship with you. So much so that God came down to earth and suffered physically for you. That's one reason God comes to us— to help us to be in a relationship with him. God wants that so much. God, you could say, thirsts for it. Continued....

The Seven last words of Jesus continued "It is finished!" Jesus understands disappointment-...We may feel that our dreams are ending but God has other dreams for us....We may feel that hope is dead but God is the source of all hope. 'All will be well in the end. And if all is not well, then it is not the end.'

"Father into your hands I commend my spirit" Jesus understands self-offering.... Father we may not know what kind of new life will come from our offering. And he knows that the more we give ourselves to the Father, the more new life can come from whatever we give. The more we give of ourselves, the more we know who we are. The more we give of ourselves, the fuller lives we will lead. And so, into your hands, O God, we commend our spirits.

Bus Connects.: This project has not gone away! The 3rd stage - Blanchardstown to City route, through our area as usual, is now closed - and only on line. NRCC had many meetings on this issue and submitted a strong report and suggestions to the National Transport Authority (NTA). We would hope that this project will be subject to an Oral Hearing, where we can make submissions. Our main concern now is that we will not have a "live" hearing and we may be offered a ZOOM meeting instead. We do not want this as, we had a number of ZOOM meetings prior to the submission of our report - and to say the least, these meetings were not helpful and again, not available to all those people not on line. If you are talking to our Councillors, TD's and Senators, please impress on them the urgency of making contact with the NTA and to say that our community wants a public hearing and to have the date pushed back to facilitate this when - hopefully - the Covid19 situation is under control and consultations can take place properly in public.
