

MARY THE MOTHER WHO CARED FOR JESUS (From Laudato Si)

"Mary, the mother who cared for Jesus, now cares with maternal affection and pain for this wounded world. Just as her pierced heart mourned the death of Jesus, so now she grieves for the sufferings of the crucified poor and for the creatures of this world laid waste by human power. Completely transfigured, she now lives with Jesus, and all creatures sing of her fairness. She is the woman, 'clothed in the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars' (Rev 12:1). Carried up into heaven she is the Mother and Queen of all creation. In her glorified body, together with the risen Christ, part of creation has reached the fullness of its beauty. She treasures the entire life of Jesus in her heart, and now understands the meaning of all things. Hence we ask her to enable us to look at this world with eyes of wisdom." (cf. Lk 2:19,51)

SHEKINAH ONLINE COURSE 2021-2022

Level 7 Diploma in Spirituality – Applied Youth Ministry and Facilitation. Online course accredited by St. Patrick's college, Maynooth

The course runs from September to April. Delivered online, students view lecturers and live e-tutorial sessions, access readings, ask questions, engage in discussions and complete assignments online. The course is designed with flexibility in mind, enabling the student to balance study with work and family commitments. The practical element will comprise the on-line planning and delivery of four youth retreats/parish reflective youth experiences. The skills are transferable to other situations. Training for this is included in the course.

ECUMENICAL BIBLE WEEK 2021

Ecumenical Bible Week 2021 is an exciting and successful venture which is now in its eight year and will run from **Pentecost Sunday (23rd May) to Trinity Sunday (30th May) 2021**. Ecumenical Bible Week (EBW) is led by the Archdiocese of Dublin and the United Dioceses of Dublin and Glendalough in collaboration with many other Christian traditions ranging from the Evangelical Alliance to Lutherans, Methodists, Presbyterians and support from the National Bible Society and Scripture Union. The overall theme this year is "Unlocking Faith Today: Responding to New Realities". This year EBW will have an opening and closing prayer event organised by Holy Trinity Rathmines on Monday 24th and St Finian's Lutheran Church on Sunday 30th respectively. NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

A little positive news for a change; OPW inform us the renovated Cabra Gates will be re-installed during the ongoing road works. These works are, so far, on schedule/ due to end 18th June. Sadly, Ashtown Gates will take longer, as "extensive works are required on the stonework and piers, prior to re hanging the gates". NCRd. Gates and Glenmaroon Gates are already back in place and looking wonderful.

As mentioned last week, Odd Lamp Road is open to through traffic, for duration of the roadworks, with access to/from Chesterfield Avenue. Driving from city area, to this direction, there is only a left turn coming off it, towards Ashtown Gate to exit Park. It gets very busy there at times, with long traffic queues. If going to Odd Lamp road area with families & children, be careful of passing traffic. Low ramps have been installed on the Visitor Centre side of the road - to slow traffic for the safety of walkers, as there is no footpath on that side.

PLEASE, PLEASE bring home all food/picnic litter and ask others to do so. OPW hope to trial a number of waste bins with lids, to try prevent so much unsightly litter/rubbish. This is a pity as such items & extra signage urbanises the Park, which is our very large garden for the people of Dublin and the country.
