St. Joseph- The Dream of Vocation by Pope Francis

God looks on the heart (cf. 1 Sam 16:7), and in Saint Joseph he recognised the heart of a father, able to give and generate life in the midst of daily routines.

Vocations have this same goal: to beget and renew lives every day.

The Lord desires to shape the hearts of fathers and mothers: hearts that are open, capable of great initiatives, generous in self-giving, compassionate in comforting anxieties and steadfast in strengthening hopes.

The priesthood and the consecrated life greatly need these qualities nowadays, in times marked by fragility but also by the sufferings due to the pandemic, which has spawned uncertainties and fears about the future and the very meaning of life. Saint Joseph comes to meet us in his gentle way, as one of “the saints next door”. At the same time, his strong witness can guide us on the journey.

Saint Joseph suggests to us *three key words* for each individual’s vocation.

The first is *dream*. Everyone dreams of finding fulfilment in life. We rightly nurture great hopes, lofty aspirations that ephemeral goals – like success, money and entertainment – cannot satisfy. If we were to ask people to express in one word their life’s dream, it would not be difficult to imagine the answer: “to be loved”. It is love that gives meaning to life, because it reveals life’s mystery. Indeed, we only *have* life if we *give* it; we truly possess it only if we generously give it away.

Saint Joseph has much to tell us in this regard, because, through the dreams that God inspired in him, he made of his life a gift.

DUBLIN DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE TO KNOCK ONLINE ADULT & FAMILY PILGRIMAGE

The Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage to Knock will take place on Saturday April 24th with a programme of online workshops from Our Lady of Victories Church, Ballymun Road via [webcam](#) commencing at 11.50am. The workshops themes will include Challenge for Families, the Holy Spirit and St Joseph & the apparition. From 2.30pm, we will switch to the Knock Shrine [webcam](#) for the rosary, the Pilgrimage Mass at 3pm and opportunity for quiet time in the Apparition Chapel. More details to follow next week. Last month, Pope Francis elevated Knock to an International Sanctuary of Special Eucharistic and Marian Devotion, placing it at the same level as Lourdes and Fatima. We look forward to welcoming you on our virtual pilgrimage which we hope will be a moment of inspiration and encouragement for our Archdiocese at such challenging year for so many people.

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

RE: Road closure on North Road, Phoenix Park from Ratra House to Garda H.Q. scheduled till 18th June - NOTE: Odd Lamp Road, (beside Ratra House) is now opened to traffic to/from Chesterfield Avenue while road works continue. If walking or cycling there with families, young children etc., please take care, as people are used to this road being free of such traffic. Left side beside Ratra House has a footpath, but right side beside Visitor Centre area has no footpath. Odd Lamp Road is so called - "due to location of just one lamp standard on the road - at the apex of the triangle. Probably put there for directional reasons at the time, as opposed to a source of light" -OPW. A well-known local former 'lamplighter' may well have more information on this. Recently a radio interviewer decided on the spot - 'this must be a mistake, they must mean Old Lamp'!

New School information as supplied by a local T.D.; on "both Pelletstown ETNS and Edmund Rice Secondary School Castleknock (on former Racecourse lands) two vital school building projects. A letter of Intent (LOI) has issued from Dept. of Education to the preferred tenderer for each of the projects, meaning the builders can now put in place the Bond, insurances, and confirmations of all legal arrangements required under the Contract. Once the Department of Education receives all of these documents and is happy with them, the building works will be able to begin. These new schools will be state of the art." Pelletstown planning permission granted 2019 - No. 2056/19, will be the first permanent school the young children will have, only up to 4th class. Those currently in pre-fab buildings since their school life started, when leaving to next stages, will never have been in a permanent 'built' school-room. The Pelletstown Action Plan 2000 contained the provisio - 'a primary school overlooking Tolka valley with playing fields' ! "
