Archbishop Dermot Farrell was asked in an interview recently (Intercom Nov.)
Despite the challenges ahead, do you remain optimistic for the future of the Irish Church?

“While I acknowledge that there is underlying crisis of faith, which is particularly acute in the younger generations, I am not pessimistic about the future of the Church in Dublin. Notwithstanding the secularisation which continues apace, I do feel confident about the future. Since my arrival in Dublin I have been visiting faith communities throughout the diocese.....What gives me optimism is that the Church has something to offer people, and there are many people who hunger for what it offers. Bringing people to Christ is not one work among many; rather it is the central work of the Church, around which everything else that we do revolves. It is important work of evangelisation, of guiding people towards a life closer to the word of Christ, we can get trapped in isolation and indifference. To avoid the latter, we must summon up the courage to confront our fear and speak the Word of God to the culture as Jesus did in his day.”

GUIDELINES WHEN ATTENDING MASS IN THE CHURCH

**It is wonderful to have people attending Mass in such great numbers
Everyone is very welcome**

- Every second pew will be available for use.
- We will maintain a max of three people per pew or a family.
- People will still be required to wear face masks and to sanitise their hands on entering the church.
- Communion will continue to be distributed to people in their pews to reduce movement in the church.
- Separate entry and exit doors will remain in place.
- Ushers will greet you on arrival and give you an antiseptic wipe to clean your seat when you are leaving.
- All missalettes used must be taken home with you or placed in the bins provided at the doors.

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL PHOENIX PARK NEWS: New seating installed- 6 new seats within the 'Triangle' on Odd Lamp Road -just in from Blackhorse Ave., across from Visitor Centre. A lovely area to sit, not lonely, with surrounding trees from every angle. 2 more seats, 1 just inside Cabra Gate, 1 further upwards. New rather unattractive large bins, but which appear to be doing their work, almost no take-away food litter to be seen. Park is looking very lovely - long grasses and nettles left under some trees facilitates breeding and habitats.

OPW Newspaper ads in August: "Invites event management companies to submit expressions of interest for staging concerts/musical events - on **two weekends only in 2022 during a period from 20th June to 30th September, 2022. They may propose a maximum of 3 performances on their preferred week-end.**" This is at odds with the 'Policy on use of Phoenix Park' dated 6th May, 1997 for such events - Item No. 6 states '*Having regard to potential impact on Park, its residents and RESIDENTS IN VICINITY OF THE PARK, in any year, no more than 1 pay-in & 2 free events should be permitted*'. If Bloom is also proposed, usually June Bank Holiday week-end - it would result in 3 entire week-ends of private fee paying events, usually closing off the children's' playground, first week-end of summer. If a week-end event takes place around 30th September, playground would close off on last school holiday week-end. An amending document, 9th May, 1997 "*re-affirms the central importance of public consultation, taking account of all legitimate concerns, AND IN PARTICULAR, THE IMPACT ON NEARBY RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITIES, seen as crucial to any decisions.....*" Event Licence fees go directly to the Exchequer and are of no direct benefit to the Phoenix Park."
