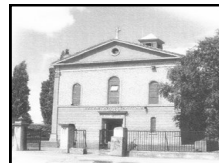

- We will maintain a max of three people per pew or a family.

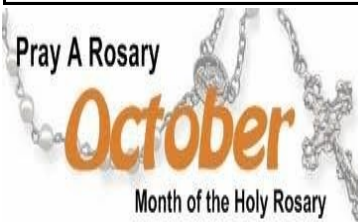

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

View on line at Dart+Maynooth Line-consultation – Iarnród Éireann & NTA plan to close 5 level crossings. After requests from many this consultation has been extended to 6th November. Please make submissions to: dartmaynooth@irishrail.ie / post: **Community Liaison Officer, DART + West, Iarnród Éireann, Inchicore Works, Inchicore Parade, Dublin 8., D08K6Y3. THE PLAN;** To close Ashtown level crossing, making Ashtown Road a cul de sac, bringing traffic, cyclists and pedestrians down a long tunnel, UNDER part of Mill Lane, UNDER the rail line, and on UNDER the Royal Canal coming up behind Rathborne shops. The current footbridge is useless to people with disabilities, wheel-chairs, baby buggies etc. A new Glass type lift with telephone is promised - The local Ashtown Riding Stables will be gone in the plan, despite large numbers campaigning to keep them open. Intrusions into entrance area Martin Savage Park with loss of trees. We have professional advice showing how the rail line can be brought under Ashtown level crossing, leaving the road intact for cars, cyclists and pedestrians, **Option 9** of the proposals. There is no indication that Bus Connects & I. E. have consulted each other on the joint results from both proposals. **PLEASE CONTACT YOUR LOCAL REPS,** if concerned.
