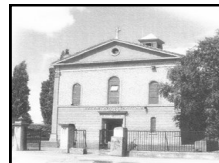

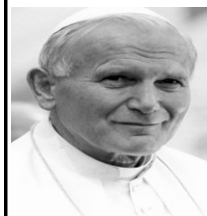

View on line at Dart+Maynooth Line-consultation – DART+Maynooth 'Public' consultation **NOTE;** Last week, we gave the wrong e.mail address if you wished to submit, despite time line of 6th October. **N.B.** Correct e.mail is **DARTwest@irishrail.ie** Apologies. If you sent to the wrong address, please re-send to **DARTwest@irishrail.ie** . As mentioned last week, we have been told I. Eireann have agreed they will accept late submissions. The Plan again:- Close Ashtown level crossing, with Ashtown road to become a cul de sac, replaced by road & footpath into a long deep tunnel, under rail lines and under the Canal. We have submitted professional advice on how to drop the rail line at Ashtown, (no tunnelling required) leaving a roadway in place for walkers; cyclists; families with buggies; wheelchair users; and all traffic. There is an example of a similar dropped line at Dunlaoghaire - no deep tunnel . Your views are important, especially if you are a walker to/from Royal Canal, to shops in the Rathbourne area, or access Pelletstown, and do not wish to use a deep tunnel. This unsatisfactory 'consultation' was launched as school and government holidays began/only on line, depriving all those without internet of all knowledge. All our public reps are aware of the inadequate, very short 'public' consultation period See www.navanroad.com

THE CRY OF THE EARTH - THE CRY OF THE POOR
The Climate Catastrophe-Creation's Urgent Call For Change
By Archbishop Dermot Farrell

“According to the most recent and very sobering UN inter-governmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report, climate change is rapid, extensive, and intensifying. The climate catastrophe is causing major climate disruption, which in many circumstances is irreversible. This pastoral letter is not an attempt to replace either what scientists, civil leaders or various climate movements are saying. Neither does it seek to displace the appropriate leadership which is their responsibility. Consequently, the importance of the forthcoming UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26), which will take place in Glasgow from 31st October to 12th November 2021 is to be noted. Such conferences and their common agreements are vital in raising public awareness and creating political momentum in the face of the climate catastrophe. This pastoral letter seeks to engage a further dimension, and approaches the climate catastrophe from the conviction of faith: this means facing the crisis with a deep sense of reality and a profound sense of hope.”
