The following themes will help us to focus our attention as we journey together
 Following from last week

4. SPEAKING OUT IN TRUTH
Everyone is invited to speak with courage and parrhesia, that is, in freedom, truth, and charity. What helps or hinders us from speaking up courageously, candidly, and responsibly? When and how do we manage to say what is important to us?

5. ROOTED IN PRAYERFULNESS
"Walking together" is only possible if it is based on communal listening to the Word and the celebration of the Eucharist. How do prayer and liturgical celebrations actually inspire and guide our common life and mission in our community?

6. RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR COMMON MISSION IS SHARED
Synodality is at the service of the mission of the Church, in which all members are called to participate. How is every baptised person hearing a call to participate in the mission of the Church? How is discernment about missionary choices made and by whom?

7. CHURCH AND SOCIETY IN DIALOGUE
Dialogue requires perseverance and patience, but it also enables mutual understanding. What are the places and means of dialogue within our local Church? How are divergences of vision, or conflicts and difficulties addressed?

Bishops' Pilgrimage and Mass in Knock
 The Covid-19 pandemic has been a particularly difficult time for those who have lost loved ones and have often had to cope with their grief without many of the usual spiritual and community supports.
 To pastorally support everyone who has suffered the pain of bereavement during the pandemic, and in the context of the month of November as the traditional time when we remember our dead, on **Sunday, 14th November at 3.00pm, the Bishops of Ireland will undertake a pilgrimage to the International Eucharistic and Marian Shrine in Knock.**
 The bishops will concelebrate Mass for all those who have died in our country during the pandemic, and for their families. At the Mass the bishops will also offer prayers of thanksgiving for all those who so selflessly sacrificed so much during the pandemic. This Mass will be live-streamed on www.knockshrine.ie and broadcast on the RTÉ News Now digital television channel and online. The bishops invite everyone to join with them in prayer on this solemn occasion.

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL
 We have written to the OPW regularly, supporting the return of their Shuttle Bus service, launched some years back, not well advertised, now closed down. This was a 'Hail & Ride' service, people could get on / off wherever they wished, no need for bus stops/was a good colour to respect the Park environment. It also ensured roads were less lonely, with constant use. Many people supported the return of the shuttle bus in their submissions to the recent Mobility Study for the park.
Buses; The Phoenix Park is served by many bus routes - along the Navan Road, six routes, including No. 37 which travels close to a gateway near the Zoo. Along Parkgate St. 8/10 bus services, beside the Historic main entrance area (Gates missing/lost since The Eucharistic Congress 1932.
Car Parking; There are many parking spaces throughout the Park, including the reopened one in this area, just inside the Ashtown Gate. At the Papal Cross/139; The Visitor Centre/179; Outside Garda H.Q./102. Farmleigh/630; along Acres Road/18; near Polo Grounds/19 etc. Most include bicycle parking spaces.
Road closures; Remembrance Run Sunday next 14th - some closures between 8.30a.m & 1.00 p.m. including Chesterfield Avenue. LEFT TURN only coming in from Ashtown Gate & Castleknock Gate.
