THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The third week of Advent is marked by **two purple candle bars** and one **pink candle**. This third week reminds us of **JOY**. We are together delighted to welcome the birth of Jesus our Saviour. The third candle is called the Shepherds Candle because the news of joy about the birth of Jesus Christ was first communicated to humble and sincere people. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas.

"But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people." (Luke 2:10)

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Adding to our concerns of extra traffic along Navan Road, from both Bus Connects, and Irish Rail proposed road tunnel under both Canal, and Rail line to close off Ashtown Level Crossing and Ashtown Road - we are requesting digital speed displays on Navan Road, since May 2019. DCC's reply to Police Forum in October; "Navan Road is a major radial route in/out of city - There are a number of speed limit signs plus repeater signs along the stretch of road and additional signage would lead to a proliferation of signage in the city & associated maintenance cost they incur. The view in Traffic is there is sufficient speed limit signage and repeater signs along this stretch to inform motorists of the speed limit. In addition to the regulatory speed limit signage, road markings outlining the speed limit (roundels), have been installed recently between Ashtown and Ashtown Grove, to further remind motorists of reduction of the speed limit when coming from the Fingal boundary at Ashtown. Slow road markings are also installed along Navan Road. We aim to provide appropriate information whilst reducing street clutter & proliferation of signage within the city. Residents insist these digital displays will be of benefit to Navan Road. All Councilors attending are willing to back this Motion to Roads & Traffic Department. Ongoing" We continue to monitor this matter.

REMINDER; try to submit on Greater Dublin Area Transport Strategy by 17th December on both these issues. We have submitted professional advice on dropping the rail line at Ashtown, no tunneling required, leaving Ashtown Road intact. www.nationaltransport.ie/publicconsultations/
