

The Navan Road/Pelletstown Police Forum will be held Thursday

 you the link on the day. If you have a serious issue you hope to
 raise on their Agenda please send in as soon as possible. DCC de-
 cide the Agenda. Gardaí first give about half hour report on matters
 within our area since October Forum, then DCC discuss items/
 results etc., then open to attendees.

**We requested restoration of semi mature trees, to soften views
 and reduce noise at new Pelletstown Station - the response:**

"Reply from Parks: "Reinstatement and upgrade works are ongoing
 at Ashington Park as train station is nearing completion. As part of
 the conditions to use this open space as a compound for the dura-
 tion of these works, a program of works have been developed
 which include resurfacing and upgrading of existing tarmac facili-
 ties, additional tree planting and a number of bulb and wildflower
 planting areas for additional colour and biodiversity. A new pedes-
 trian pathway connecting station to Ashington Park road has been
 constructed and some of the roadside mounded areas have been
 reduced to provide a more open, safe and permeable space for both
 surrounding residents and park users. Parks are also reviewing op-
 tions for a new playground and pitch improvements as the train
 station comes into operation DCC to investigate further with
 Parks - Ongoing"

DIOCESAN SYNODAL PATHWAY

Excerpt from: 'Let Us Dream-The Path to a Better Future' by Pope Francis

"The question is whether you're going to come through this crisis and if so, how. The basic rule of a crisis is that you don't come out of it the same. We are living in a time of trial. The bible talks of passing through fire to describe such trials, like a kiln testing the potter's handiwork (Sirach 27:5) The fact is that we are all tested in life. It's how we grow. In the trials of life, you reveal your own heart: how solid it is, how merciful, how big or small. Normal times are like formal social situations: you never have to reveal yourself. You smile, you say the right things, and you come through unscathed, without ever having to show who you really are. But when you are in a crisis, it's the opposite. You have to choose. And in making your choice you reveal your heart. Think of what happens in history. When people's hearts are tested they become aware of what has held them down. They also feel the presence of the Lord, who is faithful, and responds to the cry of His people. The encounter that follows allows a new future to open up.
