ARCHDIOCESE OF DUBLIN PILGRIMAGE TO KNOCK:

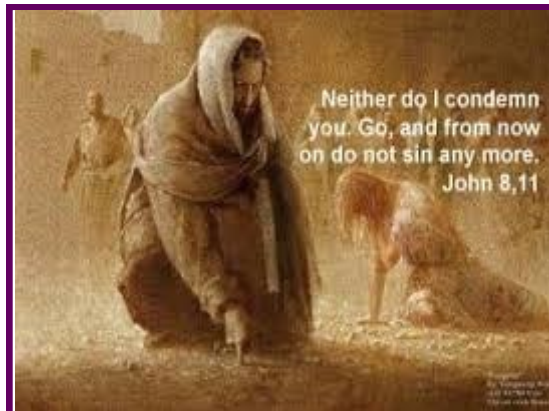

SURROGATE MOTHERS IN UKRAINE

"The situation of surrogate mothers in Ukraine has been highlighted by the Viennese bioethics institute IMABE, writes *Christa Pongratz-Lippitt*. "The international media above all concentrate on the worries of the would-be parents who are concerned about their babies' security in the war zones but no one is interested in the fate of the surrogate mothers," IMABE's spokeswoman, Susanne Kummer, told Kathpress on 14th March. Ukraine had been a "popular and relatively cheap" country for clients to search for babies, Kummer noted. Between 2,000 and 2,500 babies had been carried to term by Ukrainian surrogate mothers, with 90% of babies "exported". The BioTechCom Centre for Human Reproduction, with offices in Kyiv, had cornered 25% of the global market for surrogate motherhood, Kummer said. A baby cost the client between €40,000 and €65,000, according to Princeton University's *Journal of Public and International Affairs*, Kummer recalled. Ukrainian surrogate mothers, who usually came from precarious backgrounds and received between €8,000 and €10,000 per baby, with the rest going to the agents."

Sadly, our yellow ribbons, showing the wonderful trees targeted for removal by Bus Connects WERE AGAIN CUT DOWN, last week - a 2nd time by an unknown person. It has been reported to Cabra Gardaí by ourselves, and those who saw it happening. Depending on our energy we may put up more ribbons, OR, if you, a resident love a tree near you, maybe tie a ribbon on it. Taking great care not to trip, or step too close to the road. **DART Maynooth;**

Electrification Maynooth line, Irish Rail have produced another plan for Ashtown which involves long winding footbridges, similar to Pelletstown, with a deep tunnel still in place UNDER rail line and UNDER Royal Canal, for cars & cyclists, NOT pedestrians this time. Our own professional advice, and another separate advice, with detailed professional drawing/plans, have shown how the rail line at Ashtown can be dropped (with no tunnelling required) -leaving Ashtown Road in place for traffic, cyclists, pedestrians, and horses, and local green habitats left in place. Once again, all plans only on line, depriving those not on internet of information. **Thursday 31st March** between **6 p.m - 9 p.m.** Irish Rail are holding a drop in evening at Plunkett's Club House, with officials present, to show their plans.
