

Navan Road avenue of trees; Our Bus Connects sub-committee have safely put notices on some trees along Navan Road, to accompany our yellow ribbons, so people know why the ribbons are there. To date we have had no further contact or information from National Transport Authority (NTA) on their continuing plans for Navan Road area.

TREES: apart from their beauty, absorb an enormous amount of carbon/fuel emissions from the endless stream of traffic along Navan Road; provide habitats for birds; give some privacy to houses fronting onto the road. Trees are also important for reducing stress. Just consider the difference between our tree lined environment, and an area with few or no trees at all. Trees counted on South & North side Cabra Cross to Ashtown: 67 South & 45 North side.

FORMS OF FRIDAY PENCE

The following are suggested as ways of fulfilling Friday penance:

- Abstaining from meat or some other food.**
- Abstaining from alcoholic drink or smoking.**
- Making a special effort at involvement in family prayer.**
- Making a special effort to participate in Mass on Fridays.**

- Making the Stations of the Cross.**
- Fasting from all food for a longer period than usual and perhaps giving what is saved to the needy.**
