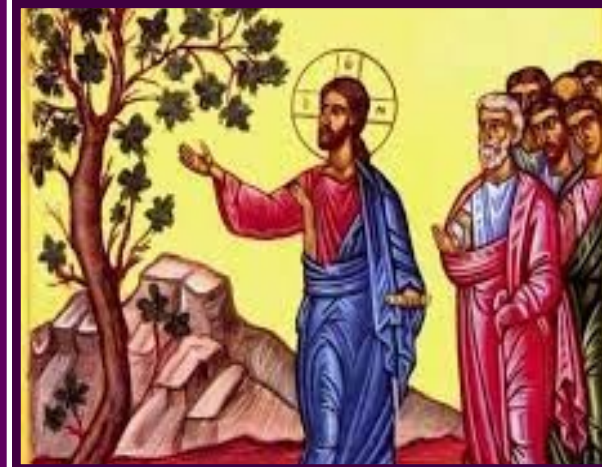

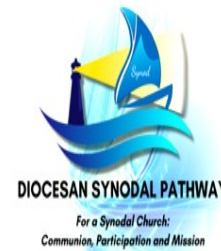
THE PARABLE OF THE FIG TREE

**NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY
COUNCIL**

UNWELCOME follow up to last week's item - Navan Road avenue of trees under threat from Bus Connects.

1. Government gave permission to Bus Connects to lodge a planning application; 2. announcement of 'rise in harmful pollutants & Nitrogen dioxide levels, within Dublin, especially at entry/exit areas Port Tunnel, Pearse St. and M.50.

We have on record, since Sunday Tribune 1/7/98 - study on air pollutants confirmed 'average amount of pollutants for March '96 was 63 micrograms per cubic metre; areas where study carried out were Merchants Quay, Rathmines and Ashtown Grove' Consider how traffic has increased since that date. Key elements outlined in forthcoming plan to implement Core Bus Corridor ignores one key element - reducing car numbers so that ours, & other tree lined environments are protected. It ignores also Climate Change agenda to which our Govt. has committed.

Our Core Bus Corridor sub-committee have been informed of next stages. All is not lost, the Committee will meet shortly to dissect current status of the project, and how best to inform everyone what is happening, and continue to influence a fair, effective and sustainable future for the Navan Road & surrounding residential areas.
