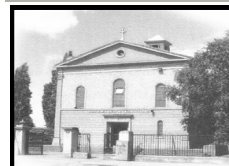

SUFFERING FOR THE LORD *by Flor McCarthy*
To practice one' faith is becoming more difficult. In the past, the climate was conducive to faith. The culture was basically Christian, and believers felt supported in that culture. But this is no longer the case. All the cultural references are in danger of being lost. We

now live in a society that is largely secular. In such a society people of faith tend to be regarded as irrelevant. But we must never forget that we are disciples of Jesus. He depends on us to bear witness to him in the world today. As Christians we have to be in the world while not allowing ourselves to be absorbed by the world. We can't tell in advance where the Christian vocation will take us, or what it might demand from us. But whatever the Christian vocation demands of us will be returned with a hundredfold increase.

NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

With longer evenings, remember Dublin City Council gifted us all - 9 grand Exercise Machines in Martin Savage Park playing fields, a public park, very lovely just now with hedges growing & trees coming into bloom ; 5 machines closer Glendhu end, 4 closer to Martin Savage Park houses, along the footpath, many different functions. Some are designed if using a wheelchair. If you have understandable anxieties about touching bars and surfaces, maybe wear soft washable gloves. **BLOOM**; Bloom returns this year, 2nd - 6th June, Visitor Centre, Phoenix Park. Good news to many, not so good for local residents tormented by excess traffic throughout their roads, and long delayed buses, after a days work - often back to Stoneybatter. We are very concerned about major confusion this year, with North Road now one way in to City - a route cars use heading to the large parking spaces beside Visitor Centre/which damages 2 large green areas. We hope to liaise with local Gardai as always, and have tried several times to contact Bloom, via Bord Bia/no return call to date. Unfortunately, Bloom means the public playground in Visitor Centre, closes to the public during the entire event - we regularly ask that it remain open to families at the very start of summer period.
