

### HOPES

1. YOUTH: Their support for each other. Their prayers at youth gatherings Taizé. They won't be as judgemental as others in the past. Increase in numbers attending. Hearing the voice of children & babies.
2. The synodal process, being asked for input and the respect for peoples opinions.
3. Pope Francis: The fact he wants to hear from the grass roots. His courage to speak out, to address issues within the Church. More in touch with everyday problems
4. The positive influence of foreign nationals on our church: The number attending, their strong faith, showing example to their Irish friends. The importance of faith to the Ukrainians
5. Lay people active within the Church as volunteers & in various ministries
6. Being able to receive the Blessed Sacrament and pray as a congregation
7. The value of social media & new technology used to connect to housebound & the youth. Providing a means for people to attend various celebrations.
8. Membership of the Catholic faith & the promise of Eternal life
9. Church's message for people to Love one Another. Equality of all people in the Church.
10. The church being physically open & a safe place to visit.
11. The Church's stance on climate change
12. People attending the church freely
13. Hope through the suffering of the church. The church has survived over 2000 years
14. The Church embracing change without losing it's core values & teachings.
15. Archbishop Farrell's Easter letter
16. Finding faith in those who don't attend. Different ways of celebrating & expressing

### FEARS

1. Lack of Vocations-will result in; the reduction of Masses, the closure of churches, loss of individual Parish, merging of parishes, larger parishes will reduce the sense of friendship. Priests are not speaking enough about the call to the priesthood
2. Lack of faith in the youth; children not continuing their faith after receiving the Sacraments
3. Parents not passing on the faith, not bringing their children to mass. Parents not having faith to pass on. Lack of faith formation. Priests not linking in with the youth. People don't see the importance of faith within the family
4. The lasting effect of scandals on the church.
5. The Church has no relevance to people under 50. People moving away from the Church. Too much secularism in society & it's effect on the Church.
6. The exclusion of women becoming priests
7. People forgetting that we are all sinners & that Jesus died for us
8. Fear of a split in the Church as some countries are at odds with the teachings of Pope Francis.
9. Too much reliance on priests for the Eucharist to be available to people
