BUS CONNECTS; We received professional advice, unfortunately, too late for our public meeting on 16th August., on legal CPO procedures, This is on our webpage; wwwnavanroad.com for your information. Those who received CPO's along Navan Road who wish to make contact with us, can do so on the BusConnects WhatsApp we set up. Otherwise we are contactable by email at navanroadcc@gmail.com We also learned last week, that, 'due to an administration error', The BusConnects Blanchardstown to City Centre scheme must go back out to consultation until 3rd November. This appears to only relate to the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Natura Impact Statements at sections 6.1 - 6.12 of Vol 3. It appears the Reports were not on the NTA website, although available in the voluminous documentation at An Bord Pleanála. We checked on fees with Bord Pleanála - there is no fee for those who have already submitted, if re-submitting on this specific section. But any first time submissions, must be accompanied by the regulatory €50 fee. This is not clear from their information. Bord Pleanála **01 8588100 and www.busconnects.ie**
We hope to return to monthly meetings in or around October/November, depending on space available.
