### POPE FRANCIS WILL VISIT BAHRAIN NOVEMBER 3rd to 6th

Pope Francis is set to make an Apostolic Visit to the Kingdom of Bahrain on 3-6 November 2022, to encourage the country's small Catholic flock and to attend the "Bahrain Forum for Dialogue: East and West for Human Coexistence".

Pope Francis was formally invited to visit Bahrain and attend the Forum by King Hamad bin Isa Al-Khalifa. He will then make a courtesy visit to King Hamad at the Sakhir Royal Palace and meet with Bahrain's authorities, civil society, and diplomatic corps. On Friday morning, the Pope will attend the closing session of the Bahrain Forum for Dialogue. Later, in the afternoon, he will meet privately with the Grand Imam of Al-Azhar, then hold an audience with the members of the Muslim Council of Elders (of which Sheikh Ahmed is the Chairman) Afterwards, Pope Francis turns his attention to Christians living in Bahrain, as he holds an ecumenical meeting and prayer for peace in the Our Lady of Arabia Cathedral in Awali. On Saturday, the Holy Father celebrates Mass in the Bahrain National Stadium in the morning for the country's Catholic population, which numbers around 161,000 faithful. He holds a meeting with young people at the Sacred Heart School in the afternoon. *We wish Pope Francis a safe journey & a rewarding and fruitful visit.*

DCC recent media release:- "Dublin City Council's Tree Officer asked Horticulture & Plants Health Division of the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine to take samples from a number of dead street trees noticed in Abbey Drive, Dublin 7 in order to check for Fire-blight disease. Fire-blight is a highly contagious plant disease caused by the bacterium *Erwinia amylovora* which chiefly affects members of the *Rosaceae* (rose family) including apple trees, pear trees and related ornamentals including *Cotoneaster*, *Sorbus*, *Crataegus* (Hawthorn), *Photinia* and *Pyracantha* and can kill susceptible varieties within one growing season. Fire-blight also has capacity to impact upon the agriculture and nursery sectors and Ireland is required under EU law to act when an outbreak is detected.

The tests for Fire-blight were positive and consequently 113 trees have to be removed from Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> October in Riverston Abbey, Ashington. The trees will be felled by a qualified tree surgeon company. Tools will be disinfected after work to avoid further contamination and all tree parts will be transported in sealed trucks to be incinerated. Replacement tree planting begins this winter and will continue for three to five years. A series of 36 locations have been identified for planting this winter by the Dublin City Council's Parks, Biodiversity and Landscape Services team with a variety of tree species to avoid a monoculture of trees which might be similarly affected in the future by the spread of a disease".

### GENERAL MEETING OF THE IRISH CATHOLIC BISHOPS' CONFERENCE

Bishops congratulated Ms Teresa Devlin, chief executive officer of the National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland, on her recent appointment by Pope Francis to the Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors. Ms. Devlin highlighted that the Church in Ireland has made great strides to ensure compliance with civil and Church child safeguarding standards in the interest of safeguarding children. Ms Devlin also reflected, in general, on her discussions with survivors of abuse who retain hurt for many years after their abuse and require life-long care and support.
