LIVING IN THE LIGHT!

St. Paul says to us, 'The night is nearly over, it will be daylight soon'

We are people on whom the light has shone and still shines. We must therefore, strive to walk in the light- the light of truth and life, the light of holiness and grace, the light of justice, love and peace. Nevertheless, darkness still has power over us. Darkness can take many forms. Any

kind of hatred, enmity, lack of forgiveness, lack of reconciliation, injustice done to another etc. The first thing we have to do is recognise the darkness in our lives. That takes courage. But it takes even more courage to take responsibility for that darkness and to decide to do something about it. There is no joy in living in darkness. Quite the opposite. But with the grace of Christ we can free ourselves of the darkness. We can walk in the light. To walk in the light means to walk in joy and freedom. Isaiah says to us:

'Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord'

Advent is a wonderful opportunity to respond to these words.

St. Paul tells us that God is near. God is always near, but somehow in Advent God seems to be nearer than usual. To have a sense of God's nearness is a very great blessing. It would be wonderful if at the end of this Advent I could truthfully say that, with God's help, I had left some form of darkness behind me. That I had allowed the light to shine into some area of my life where hitherto darkness reigned.

Then I would be more ready to meet the Lord, the Lord of light, the Lord in whose presence no form of darkness can exist. *(Extract from Flor McCarthy)*

BRINGING OF THE GIFTS OF BREAD AND WINE TO THE ALTAR DURING THE OFFERTORY

At the presentation of the gifts, the faithful present the gifts of bread and wine to the priest, symbolising an offering of creation and themselves back to the Father.

This also gives an exterior sign of our internal offerings – we offer our prayers and ourselves in the same way that we offer these mere gifts of bread and wine, hoping that just as they are changed into the Body and

Blood of Christ, so may we be transformed by his grace. We all have something to offer God. We prepare to make a gift of ourselves to the Lord, offering ourselves to him as the Bread is offered.

“This is not to be viewed simply as a kind of “interval” between the liturgy of the word and the liturgy of the Eucharist. To do so would tend to weaken, at the least, the sense of a single rite made up of two interrelated parts. This humble and simple gesture is actually very significant: in the bread and wine that we bring to the altar, all creation is taken up by Christ the Redeemer to be transformed and presented to the Father. In this way we also bring to the altar all the pain and suffering of the world, in the certainty that everything has value in God’s eyes. The authentic meaning of this gesture can be clearly expressed without the need for undue emphasis or complexity. It enables us to appreciate how God invites man to participate in bringing to fulfilment his handiwork, and in so doing, gives human labour its authentic meaning, since, through the celebration of the Eucharist, it is united to the redemptive sacrifice of Christ.” Pope Benedict XVI

We will reintroduce the Offertory Procession, when members of the faithful bring the gifts of Bread and Wine to the Altar, at all Masses
