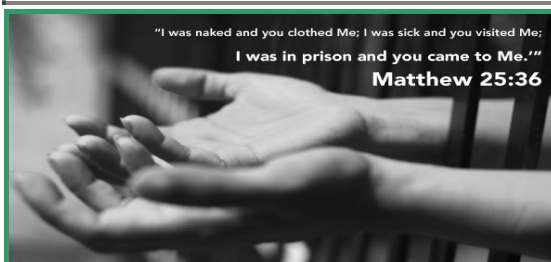

SYNODAL REPORTS - The Synodal Times-6th October (available from the Church tables) **Extract from 'Experience and Dreams as Religious Women in the Catholic Church in Ireland'**

Religious life is a charismatic, prophetic, radical way of following Christ. Despite our declining numbers and high age profile, religious women in Ireland today continue to provide very valuable, meaningful, courageous, and relevant ministries to the poor and marginalised, both in Ireland and overseas.

We are very aware of the hurt, pain, oppression, and sadness which was experienced by some of the women and children who were entrusted to our care in the past. For our failure to give the care and compassion which they so needed and deserved we are deeply sorry. We hope that we have learnt from the failures of our past.


Hurt, marginalisation and resignation have been expressed by religious women in the institutional Church, referring both to the past, and to today. There is a deep sense that we have been pruned 'to nonexistence' by the Church in Ireland.

Religious women feel faithful, resilient, hopeful, courageous, and committed – we keep the impossible dream for a more inclusive Church.....

FROM NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The River Road from Ratoath Road end direction is now re-open to two-way traffic.

PHOENIX PARK. Despite some people demanding more car parking within our beloved Park, a National Heritage Park, there are many parking spaces available, not least 220 new spaces along the North Road, to left inside the Cabra Gate all along to the Garda HQ, installed early this year; other spaces of benefit to our areas: small car park re-opened inside Ashtown Gate: 30/40 spaces; Pope's Cross: 39 & 12 cycle racks; Visitor Centre: 179 & 20 cycle racks; Lords Walk (close to Zoo): 258; Outside Garda HQ: 102; rear of Polo Grounds: 30; Acres Road: 18; Triangle area, inside from Blackhorse Ave: 19; Farmleigh: 630 with a large number of cycle racks. We note the ones on this side of Park only. There are several other on far side of Park. Therefore, there is nothing stopping all enjoying our Phoenix Park which is in lovely autumn colour at present. Remember 6 new seats in lovely triangle area surrounded by lovely groups of trees. We hope to re-start our meetings in early December - it may not be Wednesday - to be confirmed.
