FEAST DAY OF OUR LADY OF **GOOD COUNCEL 26th APRIL**

We honour Mary in the Church under many titles. Today's celebration is one particularly dear to Augustinians throughout the world. The tender image of mother and child is at one and the same time so very human and

so illustrative of a deep spiritual truth. Mary, mother of her infant son, is also his first and most faithful disciple. He who is her Lord embraces her affectionately as she, his mother, receives from him words of wisdom and counsel. We note the 'good counsel' of Mary in several scenes of the Gospel, especially that of Cana, when the mother of Jesus says, "Do whatever he tells you" (Jn. 2, 5). Saint Augustine reminds us that while Mary is blessed for being the mother of Jesus, she is even more blessed for being his disciple. In fact, as the first disciple of her son she presents him to us as our teacher, our way, our truth and our life even as he was for her.
