FROM: NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

We had a meeting with a DCC official in Cabra Offices last week; specifically, to raise the issue of dirty, untidy grass cutting (outsourced) left lying around footpaths & roads, blowing into & blocking gulleys, and causing slippage for pedestrians when wet. We asked, yet again, that contracts contain conditions to 'clean up after'. Leaving cut grass in middle of borders for regeneration is fine, ongoing for some time, but NOT along pedestrian routes & roads - we have since received acknowledgement from their Customer Service, with a ref. number. We managed to raise some other matters:-untidy entrance areas to Kinvara, at Ashtown Grove and into Ashington, with large weeds & long grasses - not conducive to entrances at large residential areas; SWALES gulley cleaning - staff to call out shortly to do so; BOULES area, should be cleared and made ready to play, to benefit people getting out and meeting neighbours. Re-cycling area is a concern, we asked this be communicated to the operating companies; burnt bin at former Post Office due to be replaced. NOTE; Blue bags will no longer be given out by DCC for common clean ups, as sadly 'some were abused with personal garden waste' In future, clear plastic bags will be given out BUT NOT COLLECTED, if it appears to be personal garden waste. Compostable bags for leaf collection only will also be given out.
