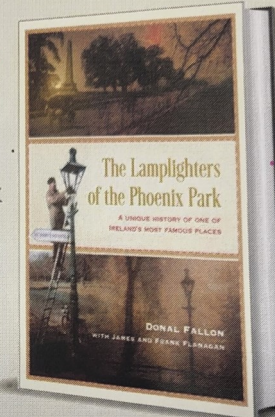

**FROM :NAVAN ROAD
COMMUNITY COUNCIL**

DART+ Maynooth, ORAL HEARING
on electrification of rail line from
Connolly Station to Maynooth, and
closure of all level crossings on the
route. We attended each day last week
at Bord Pleanála. In addition to our
original submission, we again stated
that **LOWERING THE RAIL LINE**,
between the new Pelletstown Station,
and Navan Road/Parkway Stations,
under Ashtown Road, leaving the road
open to all , is the best solution; we sub-
mitted a professional drawing to
illustrate how to do it; reducing the
enormous costs of building both a large
footbridge, and a tunnel under the Rail
Line and under the Canal.

VITAL NEW FACT: We informed the
Bord's Inspector of the relocation of our
ASHTOWN POST OFFICE, from its
long-established site at Ashtown Grove,
Kinvara, to the far side of the rail line at
Rathborne, Pelletstown and the
difficulty that will be experienced to
access the Post Office using the foot-
bridge, if the road is closed, and we are
left with only such a footbridge for
pedestrians. Contact your local public
representatives, to voice your concerns.
We support the electrification of the rail
line, **BUT NOT AT THE UNCARING
EXPENSE OF COMMUNITIES.**
