Further to our item last week, we were finally informed by DCC on 24th October last, that submissions in writing on this vital matter relating to Climate Change, could be posted to Dublin City Council, Block 1, Floor 6, Wood Quay, Dublin 2. Unfortunately, their public advertisement specified 'written submissions through the following options only' stating, a DCC Portal, or on line to climateaction@dublincity.ie with the closing date this Thursday 2nd November; so the public consultation time line is very insufficient, as it ran over summer period from September, when the public are away in & out of the country on holiday. We only saw it by accident two weeks ago, in a Newspaper from early October. We have asked was it advertised elsewhere and how often, but did not receive a response to this. We can only hope some of you have seen this over the two-month period, and had time to study and submit. If you are dissatisfied with the matter, we can only suggest you contact some, if not all of your public reps to let them know, or write in to the Chief Executive of DCC, (formerly known as Manager) at the above listed address to express your dissatisfaction.
