WORLD DAY OF THE POOR The World Day of the Poor was instituted by Pope Francis in his Apostolic Letter Misericordia et Misera in November 2016 to mark

the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. The following passage from the Apostolic letter speaks to the vision of the World Day of the Poor:

During the "Jubilee for Socially

Excluded People", as the Holy Doors of Mercy were being closed in all the cathedrals and shrines of the world, I had the idea that, as yet another tangible sign of this Extra ordinary Holy Year, the entire Church might celebrate, on the Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, the World Day

of the Poor. This would be the worthiest way to prepare for the celebration of the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, who identified with the little ones and the poor and who will judge us on our works of mercy (cf. Mt 25:31-46). It would be a day to help communities and each of the baptised to reflect on how poverty is at the very heart of the Gospel and that, as long as Lazarus lies at the door of our homes (cf. Lk 16:19-21), there can be no justice or social peace. This Day will also represent a genuine form of new evangelisation (cf. Mt 11:5) which can renew the face of the Church as She perseveres in her perennial activity of pastoral conversion and witness to mercy.

# FROM: NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY **COUNCIL**

We highlighted in a recent Newsletter "Dublin City Council (DCC) will only maintain open spaces/greens and will not be cutting grass margins in residential estates". We requested, those who are able, to please cut their own grass verges. We have also been suddenly informed, by DCC, Cabra Office, following our queries about the Autumn issue of Plants for our Planters that - 'no more plants will be issued by DCC; instead, resident's groups need to apply for a new type of Community/ Environmental Grant and purchase plants

themselves'. At present, several volunteers look after our local planters -4 at Ashtown Grove, 2 at Kinvara/Ashington entrance, 2 at Martin Savage Park - obtained by their residents. We have asked our 5 local DCC Councillors to pursue this matter, as they appeared to be unaware of these changes. We have asked our Councillors to establish the cost

difference of DCC continuing to supply the plants from their own Nursery in John Paul Park - against the costs in forming a new

'Environmental grant/the paperwork involved / dealing with Bank, etc.; and the extra vehicular journeys required by unpaid volunteers within our community to travel to Garden Centres elsewhere. If you share our concern, contact your local Councillors.
