
The Mission Office of the Daughters of Charity wish to thank the

During their Winter General Meeting in Maynooth last week, the Bishops of Ireland offered prayers of thanksgiving as 2023 marks the 800th anniversary of St Francis of Assisi constructing the first Christmas crèche in a cave

in Greccio, Italy. To mark this special anniversary in our faith history, bishops invite everyone to share a picture, or video, of their crib whether it is at home or in the workplace, along with a message. FROM NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

DART + Maynooth electrification of Rail line Dublin to Maynooth; closing level crossing, making Ashtown road a cul de sac, with deep traffic tunnel under canal; the pedestrian route to Canal walks, Post Office/shops - a new footbridge 10 metres (33 feet) above the rail tracks, accessed via a staircase of 48 steps each side (current footbridge 28/9 steps each side) for those unable to manage steps, via a 240 metre-(250 Yards) long ramp up/ down each side. This will add a Km(5/8 of mile) walk to the shops. We recently attended over 2 weeks, a Bord Pleanála Oral Hearing where we presented a detailed professional drawing, showing how to "replace proposed tunnel & pedestrian overbridge with a shallow *cutting for train lines*" i.e.,' lowering the rail line' as we call it; leaving Ashtown Road & footpath in place for all. The new POST OFFICE site was not part of the original application; As a totally new item, we submitted a set of pictures showing how it is on a very sloping roadway, far side of rail line from our area, requiring all pedestrians from Ashtown/Navan Road & surrounds to cross over & back to access PO, and City-bound trains. We explained this difficulty to the Board including the size of our area. The Hearing is now complete, awaiting a formal decision. We expressed support for electrification of the rail line, but asked for consideration for wellfare of surrounding residential areas. Similar concerns were expressed by groups from Castleknock, Coolmine, Porterstown, and onwards to Co. Kildare, including farms & stables beside Maynooth Station. Phoenix Park: some road closures 7.30 - 11.30am.
