JUST LENT 5-WEEK FIVE THEME- MIGRANTS & REFUGEES

FROM: NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

We received information from two local Councillors on the Recent **Part 8 Dublin City Council application on Martin Savage Park playing grounds**, which is one section of DCC applying to another section, under Part 8 Planning regulations. A letter from the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage dated 12th February recommended "the City Council carry out a Nature Impact Statement to consider the possible in combination effects of other presently mooted developments of artificial pitches on playing field sites utilised by the Brent geese in the Dublin area as well as that proposed in the current Part 8 proposal". The Dept. has also recommended that 'DCC propose suitable measures to reduce the potential effects of the development proposed on the geese using Martin Savage Park such as the removal of the proposed playground to a different part of the site, the deletion of new footpaths and access points.....so as to minimise possible disturbance of the geese by pedestrians and dogs'. It is proposed therefore, to withdraw the current Part 8 proposal pending consideration of recommendations as contained in this submission and discussions, as necessary, with the Dept. of Housing, Local Govt. & Heritage.

From our recent Police Forum : NRCC requested that Gardai monitor speeding and illegal parking in the Glens, Upper Ashtown Road and Villa Park. Many specific complaints were made by various residents about illegal non residential parking on footpaths, blocking pedestrians, wheelchairs & child buggies from safe routes. Gardai undertook to carry out surveys, however, **warning!** local residents can also be penalised if wrongly parked.
