FROM: NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

At our Monthly meeting last week, we had Three Councillors in attendance, two from our area, and one who intends to run here for the next election. Following issues arising at the well attended meeting, we have submitted the following items, (among others), to the Councillors, who undertook to deal with them:- 1) To ensure the Police Forum is held quarterly - alternately on Navan Road and Pelletstown; 2) To assist residents who have requested more planters within our areas, which they will maintain, and obtain further information on the issue of plants from DCC; 3) to investigate a Discretionary Fund 'available for local greening', with little information available, i.e., what does it cover? do residents have a say where/how spent? ; 4) supply picker & bag tools for Glens National Clean up day & will DCC collect rubbish?; 5) Clean up required, with a regular programme set in place, of the drain/stream stretching from Ashtown station to Reilly's Bridge - not cleaned in over 10 years - essential as part of flood protection for Glens area. We have made requests at every Police Forum for past 6/7 years, liaison with I. Eireann may be necessary; 6) parking up on footpaths at Kinvara shops, making safe access for buggies/pedestrians/school children very difficult. Members suggested bollards on edge of footpaths may be necessary in interest of Health & Safety.

As long evenings arrive, don't forget. There are **nine great exercise machines** along the footpath in Martin Savage Park, 4 of which indicate for use if using a wheelchair.
