FROM NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Navan Road / Pelletstown Police Forum -Thursday
9th May, 7.00 pm in Pelletstown Educate Together
school hall, directions, (via Ashtown Road - past
shops, right at small roundabout follow main road,
straight all along to park entrance on the right gate
with steps up, Ed. Together up small road on
left, facing Park; road entrance on a corner, take care
as cars speed greatly here). Limited parking. DCC
officials, community gardai and some Councillors
present to deal with your queries.

Further points from our last monthly meeting; we
requested of our Councillors that DCC do a survey
of footpaths, within Kinvara, particularly on
Kinvara Drive, many of which are in a very bad
state, some due to tree roots causing trip hazards -
could be made safer.

The illegal/dangerous parking at the shops on
Kinvara Park. We understand bollards to prevent
this were refused here. We asked Councillors to
please establish why bollards were refused in the
interest of pedestrian safety, and get DCC to look at
some way to stop cars completely blocking the foot-
path, pushing pedestrians, prams and wheelchair
users out onto the road. The footpaths along this
stretch of road are also in a terrible condition in
places, causing several falls in this area. We asked
Councillors to ensure DCC survey the paths with a
view to fixing them. Yet again, we raised issue of a
pedestrian crossing we requesting over 10
years, outside the Cabra Gate entrance to Phoenix
Park, a very dangerous entry/exit area to the
Park. Instead, out of the blue, DCC installed one
close to Nephin Road, well away from Park a safer
site for pedestrians. We have asked our Councillors
to establish if the safer crossing requested by us was
refused within DCC, and if so, why? We did not
receive an explanation from DCC.
