FROM NAVAN ROAD COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Our monthly meeting - next Tuesday 14th at 7.00 p.m. in 50P room, Parish Centre. We invite our Councillors as always. If you were unable to attend the recent Police Forum, we will try to give information, if required.

We are over 6 years requesting DCC to clean up the long ditch/small river, running from Ashtown Station area, past Martin Savage Park playing fields, past Glendhu, on towards Pelletstown Station, to keep it free with water running, which helps absorb some of the regular flooding throughout that area, to no avail. After Pelletstown, the river area can be clearly seen flowing towards Broombridge Station. We asked for 'clean up' NOT removal of trees. Suddenly, over the past 2/3 weeks Irish Rail engaged a company to cut down & remove almost every tree & all greenery, within the Ashtown Station area, doing so in April, outside the legal tree cutting period - an area full of breeding birds and other wildlife. We have passed on this information to DCC Parks; to Irish Rail 'liaison officer'; National Parks & Wildlife Services, and to all our local reps, including our 4 T.D.s. It is strange that DCC refuse to trim dangerous tree branches overhanging some of our residents' homes - but appear unable to prevent extensive tree removal in April. **Final item from our last monthly meeting; request to our Councillors to raise with DCC the lack of public toilets throughout the City. For film lovers, can we suggest 'A Perfect Day', a day in life of a Toilet Cleaner, who enjoys his work in Japan (sub-titled film), when you see the beauty & site specific design of his Toilets you will understand - maybe a useless dream for our Capital City?
Road closures in Phoenix Park: - Sunday 12th Chesterfield Avenue from 12.00 pm - 4.00pm. Wednesday evening 15th for Social Sunset Cycle, Chesterfield Ave. closed from 7.15 pm - 10.00pm and no right turn inside Ashtown Gate, same hours. At such peak hours this may lead to traffic delays on the Navan Road.
