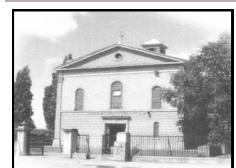

DIOCESAN SAFEGUARDING DAY 2024

Extract from the letter from Archbishop Dermot Farrell
(Full text on the tables of the church)

“The theme for this year is *A Safe and Welcoming Church for Children and Vulnerable Adults*. A Safe and Welcoming Church is the name given to the new child safeguarding policy for the Catholic Church in Ireland, which was launched in June of this year. It replaces Safeguarding Children, which dates back to 2008. The decision to give the child safeguarding policy of the Catholic Church in Ireland a new title reflects a change in our understanding and approach to safeguarding. We understand that safeguarding is not simply a response to the crisis brought about by disclosures of abuse in the Church but is something deeply rooted in gospel values, scripture and Church teaching. It goes beyond the prevention of harm and consists, as Pope Francis has written, in the creation of the material and spiritual conditions for children’s full development. It is fitting, therefore, that we take this opportunity to consider our engagement with children and also with vulnerable adults. When we hear people reflect on their faith journeys, they frequently recall childhood experiences in their local parishes through involvement with children’s choirs, altar servers or other parish activities. Of course, faith formation starts in the home but parents need their parish communities to help them raise their children to know, love and serve God.

BUS CONNECTS; Correction to our item of last week, the '49 trees and 52 hedges' mentioned are those just inside gardens, which may be removed, depending on wheather CPO's (compulsory purchase orders) are in place on some front gardens. The entire avenue of trees along Navan Road are likely to be felled, with promises of replacement trees in due course'- 83 trees North side (way in to City) and 76 trees South Side (way out) and the pine trees on the roundabout at Ashtown, as this is to return to a four-way signal junction. It took NRCC over six years of requesting to get the Pine Trees trimmed to their current lovely feature.

Hedges provide shelter for wildlife and a corridor for them to move . Hedges & trees absorb carbon.

A Canadian University Research 2015 <https://nature.com/articles/5sep1610> confirms 'even 7 trees on a City block improves health. Backyard trees are equally as important to public trees'.

In our submissions we emphasised; loss of green infrastructure & visual amenity; loss of residential amenity due to extra space dedicated to traffic; loss of safety for our school going children.
