From: Navan Road Community Council **BUS CONNECTS**; As most residents will know, BUS CONNECTS -**BLANCHARDSTOWN TO CITY** route was approved in June, by An Bord Pleanála. We support improved bus services, however our major concern was the proposed removal of mature trees along Navan Road, and onwards towards Auburn Avenue junction. Promises of 'a certain amount of replacement trees' may not replace the loss of privacy for many homes. We walked Ashtown to Skreen Road twice and estimate that approximately 222 homes, with approx. 49 trees and 52 mature hedges will be affected. On Monday 9th we attended a High Court application for a Judicial Review against An Bord Pleanála's full permission to Bus Connects. This was adjourned to 23rd September when we hope to attend again.

Dublin City Council (DCC) has a FREE notification service, 'DCC ALERTS', which gives out a variety of useful/important notifications and alert for different areas of the City by email and SMS. You can register on the DCC website. When subscribing we suggest you specify your location to ensure you only receive alerts relevant to your area.
