

From: Navan Road Community Council We attended an information meeting, from Dublin Fire Brigade on Home Safety recently-Phibsborough is our nearest point, but calls go to Tara Street. If you are 'hard of hearing' the Dept. of Housing Local Govt. can provide special free smoke alarms through the Community Smoke Alarm Scheme Ph. 01 8882000 / firesafety@housing.gov.ie. Some fire safety tips: do not use heaters close to beds/curtains/furniture. Do not leave heaters on overnight. Switch off all plugs overnight, especially phone chargers. Don't leave any electrical items charging overnight. Never leave candles lighting. Don't leave clothes in a tumble dryer. If cooking, and the phone or doorbell rings, turn off the cooker in case you are delayed. Use of extension leads or double adaptors is not recommended. New alternatives are available. Never try to repair home appliances. SMOKE ALARMS are recommended in homes- the number of alarms and the positioning is dependant on the size of your home. A fire blanket is recommended for the kitchen. Check smoke alarms regularly; Carbon monoxide alarms should be installed in all homes. Boilers, stoves, chimneys should be serviced annually. PLAN FOR A FIRE keep stairs & exit points clear of items keep key handy. All doors should be closed overnight, including bedrooms. Have a family fire escape plan, with an assembly point outside.
