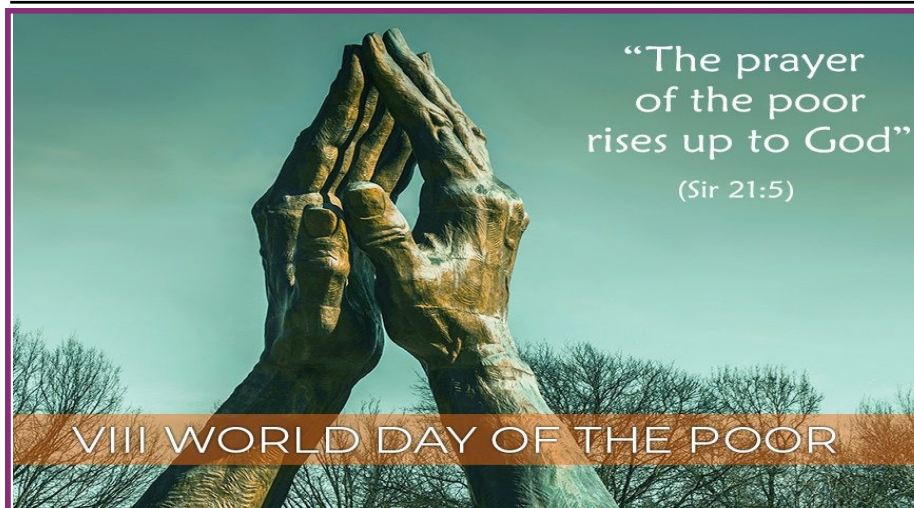

VIII WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

Why should politics cause poverty?

In his message for the 2024 World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis noted that war-driven "bad politics" generates new poverty and innocent victims. He urged everyone to pray with and for the poor, and highlighted that volunteers continue to devote themselves to serving the poorest in our cities, embodying God's response to the cries of those in need.

This year, in particular, the motto chosen by the Pope is taken from the book of Sirach: "The prayer of the poor rises to God" (Sirach 21:5). This motto emphasises that the poor hold a special place in God's heart. He hears their prayers and becomes "impatient" in their suffering until justice is done.

The Book of Sirach confirms that

"God's judgment will be in favour of the poor" (21:5).

World Day of the Poor encourages the Church to "step outside" its walls and engage with poverty in its many forms in today's world. And as over 1,300 people join him for lunch, that is precisely what Pope Francis will be doing.

As a papal charity serving the Holy Father's mission to the most vulnerable, ACN is committed to supporting the faithful wherever they are persecuted, oppressed or in need so that Christianity can thrive everywhere. It's **'Week of Witness' 17th to 24th November with 'Red Wednesday'** at the heart of this week, is an important part of the above objective. During this week we seek to raise awareness and pray for all who are persecuted and discriminated against because of their Christian faith. ACN supports 6,000 communities in 140 countries. Today, for example, they are supporting the tiny Christian community in Gaza – just 450 people remain, living in the parish church in Gaza City since the war began. ACN Ireland through the kindness of parishioners is supporting them by providing fuel to heat and run the church's generator. Pope Francis pointed out recently that one in seven Christians face discrimination because of their faith. Last year alone over 5,000 Christians were killed in Nigeria for their faith. So it is right that for at least one day in the year, all who suffer for their faith should be remembered. And that one day is this coming Wednesday **'Red Wednesday'**
