REFLECTION (Pope Francis)

Update on our item last week-**re-cycle**
area, Ashtown Grove, as received by
us; "Dublin City Council Waste
Management Services have
instructed the Inspector in charge of
Bring Centres/Banks to have the last
clothes bank removed. This will depend
on availability of a grab truck, so may
take a few days/weeks before it is
removed.

*The other Clothes Pod bank has
already been removed.*

*The correctly used bottle banks will
remain. Dublin City Council under-
stand that this is not ideal, but there
was a lot of requests from residents to
remove the clothes bank, which hope-
fully, will help reduce the illegal
dumping that occurs here"*

your Green Bin, after you deposit
bottles/glass. **PLEASE** tell others
there is no longer a clothes re-cycle bin
at Ashtown Grove.
