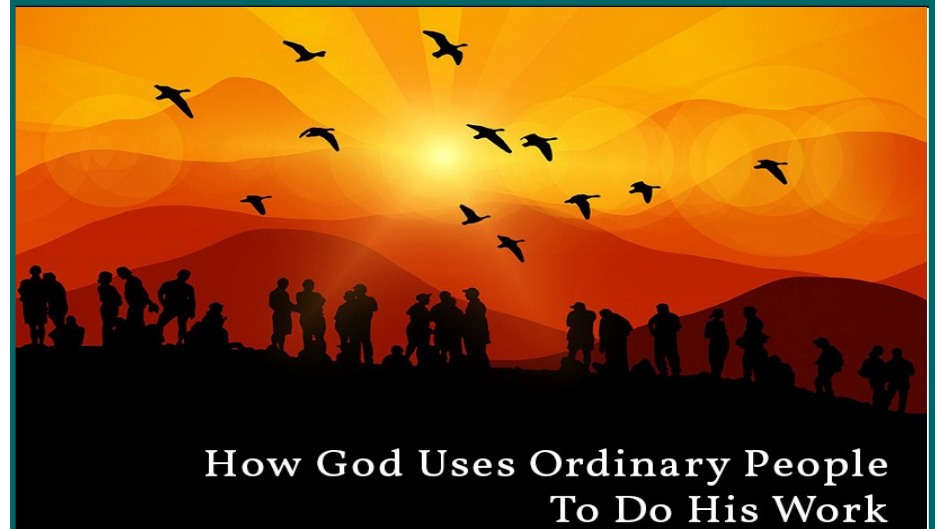

How God Uses Ordinary People To Do His Work

REFLECTION (Michael K. Marsh)

Faith will not change the circumstances of our lives. Instead, it changes us. Living in faith does not shield us from the pain and difficulties of life, it does not undo the past, and it will not guarantee a particular future. Rather, faith is the means by which we face and deal with the circumstances of life-the difficulties and losses, the joys and successes, the opportunities and possibilities. Faith however is not lived out in the abstract. It is practiced day after day in ordinary everyday circumstances.....

The question is not how much faith we have but, rather how we are living the faith we do have? How is our faith, our relationship with Jesus, changing our lives, our relationships, the lives of others? If it is not, more of the same will surely make no difference. The mustard seed of faith is already planted within us. It is Christ himself. He has withheld nothing from us. We already have enough. We already are enough. We do not need more faith. We need more response to the faith, the Christ, the mustard seed, the relationship we already have.
